MOTIONS, RESOLUTIONS, AND AUTHORIZATIONS

Supervisor Grattidge said that the Budget Transfer Resolution is to pay for the new loader. The Board feels that the best option is to pay for it out of Highway Funds and do short term borrowing later on if needed. He said that the Board knew that they were going to be reducing the amount of Town money for road construction. They still plan to do road construction with CHIPS money, as long as the Governor does not change that. The plan is to take the balance needed out of the Town portion of road construction and transfer it into the Equipment Fund. The Highway Superintendent will hold off on purchasing the new pick-up truck planned for this year.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Saratoga County has provided the Town with a good supply of face masks. Each of the Town offices and Highway crew will be supplied with masks. The Town will also make masks available to the public. The Charlton Police have agreed to deliver masks to residents. The Board asked the Town Clerk to put a notice on the Town website. The best way to contact the Clerk is email to townofcharlton.org

Spring brush pickup will be the week of May 11-14. Residents are asked to have their brush curbside by May 10th so that they do not miss the pickup. Cut ends of limbs should face the road. If residents have a large amount of brush, they can contact the Highway Superintendent for a truck to be dropped off for the resident to load.

The Charlton Seniors are holding a food drive on April 28th through 30th to collect food for the Galway Food Pantry.

The Harmony Fire Department is holding a chicken barbeque on May 17th. It will be takeout only.

Ellms Farms is holding donut drive-thrus and tours of their farm property.

The Charlton 5k Run normally held on Founders weekend has been rescheduled for September 19, 2020.

The Board agreed that the annual marking of the Veterans graves in Charlton needs to be cancelled this year. A thank you was acknowledged for Gadsden and Culpepper, a Charlton business, for once again donating the flags for the graves.

The American Diabetes Association has rescheduled their annual Tour de Cure, and is looking to secure the Charlton Town Hall parking lot for use as a rest stop. The 2020 Tour de Cure will take place on Sunday, September 13th from the Saratoga County Fairgrounds and will ride through Charlton between 7:30-10:30 am

DISCUSSION

The Supervisor said that he is not sure what to suggest about holding the summer concert normally scheduled in August. The Board agreed that they would make a decision at their May 26th Agenda meeting.

The Sales Tax for the month was \$121,828 which was 7% higher than last year. This was explained as being due to an assessing adjustment. There are concerns for the April and May reports because of the pandemic effects. The Mortgage Tax was \$11,135.99.

The Board received a chart of fund balances from the Town Account Clerk. The County Treasurer also sent an estimate of sales tax revenues. It gave assumptions of what revenues would look like depending on the amount of decrease. The Board has put a spending freeze on capital spending.

Planned road construction was discussed. Highway Superintendent Heritage said that the Highway Department is planning to redo about a one mile section of Cook Road this summer. It will be paved with a blacktop surface. They also have some culvert projects that need to be done this summer. The culverts are on Komar Drive and were damaged by heavy rain the October 31, 2019 storm. Mr. Heritage is working with FEMA on addressing a claim, and working with the Town Engineer to update the current culverts to a box culvert.

If any resident wants to do roadside clean-up, they can contact to Highway Superintendent for vests, bags and gloves.

Highway Superintendent Heritage said that his crew is practicing social distancing, wearing masks and riding in separate vehicles. So far, this seems to be working quite well.

Councilman Grasso said that there still appears to be problems with the plumbing/flushing at Town Hall. He will keep monitoring the situation.
