News From Charleton Officials

From the Town Supervisor

My spring newsletter article routine typically involves reflecting on the past year while watching snowbanks slowly fade away and patches of bare lawn grow in size. This year, winter never seemed to fully materialize. The snowbanks are long gone and fully bare lawns appear ready to begin greening up. The reflections of last year, however, conjure up the typical positive thoughts from years gone by. Charlton had a lot to be proud of in 2023, with what I consider another year of improved services to our residents and a lot of great community supported activities throughout the year.

Some important accomplishments of 2023 included advancing updates to our land use regulations, beginning design work on the rehabilitation of our Community Center, keeping taxes low on our residents both at the Town and County level, and hosting a wide array of well attended events including a busy Founder's Day Weekend. One very important accomplishment in 2023 was adding a new parttime Assistant Code Enforcement Officer in our Building Department. This was intended to increase support to our residents looking to make changes to their properties and strengthen enforcement of our zoning regulations. We continue to see many new or current landowners that have questions regarding what are permitted uses in Town, and which changes require review by our Building Department or our Boards. I strongly encourage anyone looking to make physical changes to their homes or properties, or those looking to introduce or expand any residential or commercial use, to reach out to our Building Department for assistance early in their planning.

Regarding the Community Center, the planned rehab will require the building to be closed during the construction period, with work starting either later this year or more likely, in 2025. There continues to be a funding shortfall for the necessary improvements, and the Town will continue to seek out additional grant funding opportunities and fundraising within the Town.

Regarding the updates to our land use regulations, our Land Use Review Committee comprised of many volunteers wrapped up its work last year with a broad list of recommendations that are intended to ensure development is in accordance with our Comprehensive Plan, Charlton retains its rural character and current and future agricultural activities are encouraged. The Town has recently engaged a professional land use consultant experienced in assisting rural communities like Charlton, and we expect to have draft revised zoning and subdivision regulations for more community review later this summer.

Regarding community-oriented activities, Founder's Day Weekend 2024 is shaping up to be filled with another round of widely popular events including Party in the Park, the parade down main street and the always popular Charlton Historical Society's 5k run/walk. Founder' Weekend is always the first weekend in June, so mark your calendars. Put a special star on Saturday, June 1st for Party in the Park, as this year we will be hosting Big Sky Country, the Capital Region's premier country band!

I'll close by saying a big "Thank You!" to all of our dedicated town staff and volunteers that I get to work with every day. Their commitment to keeping Charlton a great place to live is truly inspiring. Joe Grasso

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

The Highway Superintendent has announced that there will be no Spring or Fall Brush Pick-up this year. The Highway Dept will gladly provide residents with a truck to be filled with brush or bagged leaves. Contact the Highway Garage at (518)399-3425 to schedule truck drop-off and pick-up. Bagged leaf pick-up will be conducted November 4th – 8th. Leaves must be bagged in biodegradable bags.

Bulk Item Drop-off is planned for October 21st-26th at the Highway Garage on Jockey Street. The hours will be Monday – Friday 8am – 4pm and Saturday 8 am – 12 pm. As the date gets closer, there will be more information on the Town website which will list acceptable and non-acceptable items. Example: (No tires, televisions, electronics, paints, propane tanks, building / stone materials or hazardous waste).

Dog Control

New York State Law requires that all dogs be licensed and be vaccinated for rabies. Licenses can be purchased at the Town Clerk's office. The fee is \$8 for spayed /neutered and \$13.50 for unspayed / unneutered dogs. If you need assistance from the Dog Control Officer, he can be reached at: 518-365-8271.

Rabies Clinics are held at the 4-H Training Center, 556 Middleline Road, Ballston Spa. Questions? Call the Animal Shelter at 518-885-4113. The cost is free, however donations are accepted.

2024 Clinic Dates: May 28th, June 18th, August 13th, September 24th, Times: Dogs: 6:30-7:30 pm and must be on a leash.

Assessors' Office

The 2024 Tentative Assessment Roll will be available for review during Town Hall hours beginning on May 1st. If your assessment has changed, you will receive a Change of Assessment Notice in early May.

I encourage residents to discuss their assessment with me prior to Grievance Day, as many times adjustments can be made that are acceptable to both parties. An appointment is required. Grievance Day is Tuesday, May 28, 2024. The Board of Assessment Review will be present 2 - 4 p.m. and 6 - 8 p.m.

TAX COLLECTOR

After April 1st, the Tax office in the Town Hall is CLOSED until December 26. For questions and payment instructions, please call the Saratoga County Treasurer at (518) 884-4724. You may view, print, and pay your Town and County Tax Bill bills on our Town website. If you have any permanent address corrections or ownership changes on your property, please contact our Town Assessor at 518-384-0152 ext 210.

MS4 ANNUAL REPORT

The Town of Charlton's annual report for its State mandated municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4) permit will be available for public review and comment beginning April 19, 2024 on the Town website https://www.townofcharlton.org/ms4-program/pages/ms-4-reports and at the Town Clerk's office. Interested residents can submit comments at the Town Hall.

WATER DEPARTMENT

Water Department Billing Information:

Water Reading Cards: are mailed by April 30th, due back with reading by May 24th. If you do not receive a card in the mail to read your meter, please call the Water Department at (518) 384-0152, ext 210. This year we will be accepting water readings by phone, by email to waterdept@townofcharlton. org or by mail. We are not including return postage on the water cards for the 2024 water billing season.

An \$85.00 penalty is charged for late reading cards if they are received or postmarked after May 25th.

Water Bills are mailed June 30th each year and payable until July 31st without penalty. Penalty is assessed on any payment received with a postmark date after July 31st at a rate of 5%. Water Bills can be paid to Charlton Water District #1 until October 15th. After this date, delinquent water bills are sent to the county to be added to the tax bill for the following year.

BUILDING & ZONING DEPT

The Building & Zoning hours are Tuesday 2:00-4:00 & 6:00-8:00 pm, and Thursday mornings 9:00 am to 12:00 noon. We are a part time department but will make every effort to accommodate your needs. Permit applications are available in file box outside Zoning office. Applications can be dropped off anytime the Town Clerks Office is open. Just a reminder, In-ground & Above ground pools do require a permit, as well as decks.

Be Advised there is a Burn Ban per DEC from March 16th -May 15th.
